

## Drummond Certified™ Certification Seal Guidelines

The Drummond Certified™ certification seal is provided by Drummond Group Inc. (DGI) to software solutions which have been tested and certified by the Drummond Certified program for interoperability and/or compliance to a specific technical standard. Companies whose software solutions are given a Drummond Certified seal may use them in print ads, company communications, sales materials and related promotional items targeted to reach customers interested in Drummond Certified products. The seal is a mark which indicates that a software product-with-version has passed a series of tests to prove conformance and/or interoperability to technical standards. It displays to potential partners, customers and competitors that a company's solutions are compliant and/or interoperable with industry standards.

A report listing the test results and technical parameters of a specific test may be downloaded from the [www.drummondgroup.com](http://www.drummondgroup.com) website. These reports specify which test round, as well as the date, the software product-with-version was tested.

## Drummond Certified™ Certification Seal



Drummond Certified specifies which test round a product-with-version has passed in the lower right corner. The format consists of the test name followed by the date. For example, if the bottom right corner reads "ebMS – 4Q05," this means that products-with-version receiving the Drummond Certified seal passed the ebMS test conducted in the fourth quarter of 2005. ### Usage Guidelines

- Use of the Drummond Certified seal is restricted to the product-with version that received certification for a specific test round. Certification is valid for that product-with-version only, and only for the specific test specified on the seal. Other products offered by that company or versions of that product which have not undergone testing are not considered to be Drummond Certified and may not use the seal.
- Use the seal in its entirety.
- No modifications to the seal may be made without the express written consent of DGI.
- Use only the seal provided by DGI for print or electronic media.
- Maintain 0.5" of empty space around the seal.
- The seal is labeled with the specific test round and date. If it is an interoperability test, all the products-with-version which participated in a specific test round have been certified for interoperability with each other. If it is a compliance test, then the date specifies when the product was certified for compliance/conformance to a specific standard at a specific date.
- **Warning:** The Drummond Certified seal and DGI logo are registered marks of Drummond Group Inc. Consequently, their unauthorized use or misuse may be in violation of federal law.
